What is The GOAT?

The GOAT, is the Manitoba Museum's first inaugural Artisan Market, it is set to host a variety of local handmade artisans and vendors from all over Manitoba.

Where is The GOAT Location?

The GOAT will be held at the Manitoba Museum, 190 Rupert Avenue, in Alloway Hall.

What is the Date and Time of The GOAT?

The GOAT will open its doors to the public on March 23rd and 24th at 10 am, and will close at 6 pm each day.

What will I see at The GOAT?

The GOAT will feature a selection of local handmade artisans and vendors; there will be limited overlap in type of product sold, so you will see a wide variety of handmade goods including Jewelry, bath and beauty, pottery, art, house wares, plants, toys and so much more! There will also be food and beverage vendors in the Museum Foyer that will offer a selection of quality options for you to enjoy.

On top of local handmade items The GOAT will have a family activity program running throughout both days; this program will include 2 crafting activities, and will be hosted by the Manitoba Museum Staff.

Who is invited to The GOAT and what will it cost?

Everyone is invited to attend!! There will be a general admission fee to the show of \$5 per person at the door. Museum members and Museum gallery ticket holders will be admitted free.
